

# Admissions

### **Qualifications (at the Time of Application)**

- ▶ Undergraduate : Currently enrolled full-time as a sophomore or above in an accredited college or university
- ► Transfer / Graduate : Must have completed at least 1 semester at an accredited college or university as full-time

# **Admission Requirements**

▶ GPA: 2.7/4.3 [2.5/4.0] or above

► Language Proficiency (either English or Korean)

English: TOEFL iBT 79 / IELTS 6.5 or above Korean: KLAT level 4 / TOPIK level 4 or above

\*Note: Native English/Korean Speakers & students studying their degree in English are waived.

#### ▶ Yonsei Global


OIA affiliated organization, Yonsei Global, runs various programs for exchange/visiting students every semester.
