Course description:

What does the future world of work look like? This module critically evaluates contemporary trends in the changing world of work. We focus on these trends with a view to understanding their implications for work, employment and society. Some issues explored in this module are automation and AI, emotional labour, flexible working, the platform economy, climate change, regulation and the role of the state, and globalisation. The extent to which COVID-19 has disrupted, or accelerated, such trends will also be explored throughout.

Learning outcomes:

On completion of the module, students can expect to have acquired:

- An understanding of social, political, technological, environmental and economic challenges facing modern workplaces.
- Knowledge as to how external, societal factors are influencing the experience of work.
- Relevant strategies to navigate the future world of work.
- The ability to think critically about the consequences of changes to work and employment.
- An international perspective on the changing world of work.

Approximate cost: All reading material is provided digitally so you are not required to purchase any books.

Assessments:

The course assessments are not compulsory, however, if you wish to transfer credit for this course to your home university it is essential to complete the assignments.

Essay (1500 words) (80%) and In-class Test (20%)
